

GRAPHIC DESIGN - 3 Credits

PREREQUISITES:

1. Eleventh & twelfth grade level.
2. Each student should have a sincere desire to learn about the commercial arts/graphic design field.
3. Student should have strong drawing ability.
4. Must have taken at least Art I in high school.
5. A small portfolio of work and a brief letter expressing the student's future goals is requested by the instructor.
6. The student will take a basic skills test. Weaknesses indicated by this test will require remedial work.

DESCRIPTION:

Students will learn creative and technical aspects of commercial arts/graphic design including: the basics of national retail trade; industrial and professional advertising; layout and paste-up; screen printing; air brushing; and desk top publishing. When possible, guest speakers will be demonstrating to the class.

Emphasis is placed on the importance of DRAWING SKILLS, deadlines, brainstorming, responsibility, and working productively--alone and with others. In addition, safety, punctuality, and management skills will be taught.
